Tapeworm treatment is required when travelling with dogs (not cats or ferrets) from Great Britain to EU listed tapeworm free countries including Northern Ireland, Malta, Ireland, and Finland. These dogs must be treated for tapeworm not more than 120 hours (5 days) and not less than 24 hours before the time of entry into one of these countries. Please select one of the following options to confirm whether your dog will need tapeworm treatment:

NB before returning to Great Britain dogs must be treated for tapeworm not less than 24 hours, not more than 120 hours (5 days) before time of entry except for return from Northern Ireland, Finland, Ireland, or Malta. This must be done by an EU vet who must also certify this in the relevant section of the AHC.

If you are leaving Great Britain on a short trip returning within 120 hours (5 days) you must have this treatment done before leaving.

Terms & Conditions

- For the purposes of European travel and re-entry into the UK a Pet passport is no longer valid. An **Animal health certificate** is now required.
- Each Animal health certificate is **valid for 4 months** of travel and for one trip only.
- Please **make an appointment** one month prior to your travel date travel with one of our Official Veterinarians. You will need to bring all previous vaccination certificates and/or passports with you for this appointment. Your pets' microchip will be checked, and details of their previous rabies vaccination can be confirmed.
- If your pet has a Pet Passport, please make a **photocopy of the rabies vaccination section** and the **pet identification section**.
- Rabies vaccination must be administered at least 21 days prior to travel. An in-date rabies vaccination is sufficient for an animal health certificate.
- The Animal health certificate must be completed within 10 days of outward travel.
- The Animal health certificate will cost £150 for a single pet with additional £50 per additional animal.
- Please note that at least **14 days' notice** must be given prior to the date of travel for an Animal Health certificate. We will not be able to provide an Animal Health certificate if it is requested any later than this.
- Cancellation of a request for an Animal Health Certificate at a time less than 14 days prior to travel will result in full payment being required.
